

Standing with Our Immigrant Communities

The Santa Barbara Foundation is committed to creating a safe, thriving community for all. Our county is home to vibrant immigrant communities that are integral to our region’s identity, economy, and culture. **According to census data, as of July 2024, approximately 98,235 foreign-born residents live in Santa Barbara County. That is 22% of the County’s population.**

Our immigrant neighbors are essential contributors to Santa Barbara County – they are our agricultural workers, small business owners, child care providers, healthcare workers, artists, and community leaders. They enrich our culture, strengthen our economy, and make our region more vibrant. The Santa Barbara Foundation believes in the inherent value and dignity of every person, and we recognize that strong, inclusive communities benefit everyone. If our families and essential workers are unsafe, none of us can truly thrive.

Currently, many families in our community are facing fear and uncertainty. Local nonprofits report that community members are “frightened and scared,” and need access to immigration resources, supplies, and mental health support. The Santa Barbara Foundation is actively supporting frontline organizations who are providing resources and support. Below are trusted Santa Barbara County nonprofits working to strengthen our Latino and immigrant communities through direct services, legal support, and community empowerment:

- [805 UndocuFund](#): Provides emergency assistance to local immigrant families. 100% of funds raised go directly to families in need. Operates a 24/7 Rapid Response Hotline: (805) 870-8855.
- [California Rural Legal Assistance, Inc. \(CRLA\)](#): A statewide nonprofit law firm located in Santa Maria providing free civil legal services to low-income residents, primarily farmworkers.
- [Carpinteria Children's Project](#): Family Resource Center provides Know Your Rights training, resources, and mental health support to the local immigrant community.
- [Future Leaders of America](#): Central Coast nonprofit that trains and empowers low-income Latino youth and their families, and assists families with Know Your Rights, resiliency, and emergency response planning.
- [Immigrant Hope Santa Barbara](#): US Department of Justice-recognized and -accredited organization offering low-cost immigration legal services including USCIS applications and Immigration Court representation.
- [IMPORTA SB](#): US Department of Justice-authorized organization that monitors immigration policies and provides community education about civil rights.
- [Legal Aid Foundation of Santa Barbara County](#): Provides free civil legal services to low-income residents, including immigration-related legal assistance and advocacy.
- [MICOP \(Mixteco Indigenous Community Organizing Project\)](#): Community-based organization that advocates for the rights and needs of indigenous communities, including Mixteco farmworkers and their families.
- [Santa Barbara County Immigrant Legal Defense Center](#): Provides free legal services to adults and children in detention centers and during removal proceedings, ensuring that no one faces immigration court alone.
